## Baptized: Marked for Living!

"He who believes and is baptized shall be saved."

Mark 16:16a

PASTOR If you grew up in the Lutheran Church and went through Confirmation Class you are familiar with Martin Luther's Small Catechism. In this small book, Luther covers the basics of the Christian faith: the Ten Commandments, the Lord's Prayer, the Apostles Creed, the Sacraments of Holy Baptism and Holy Communion. He writes about confession and absolution and being saved by grace through faith.

Luther wrote it so that the head of the household could teach his family the essence of the Christian faith. I use today as do all confessional, orthodox Lutheran pastors, in teaching Confirmation Class.

But how many of us are familiar with his Large Catechism? Sadly, not many Lutherans have read it. I would like to encourage you, as you continue reading through the Bible, to add to you readings, Luther's Large Catechism. Use it as a refresher for your confirmation and go deeper in God's Word regarding the basics of the Christian faith

I would encourage you to read what Luther teaches about Holy Baptism, especially since that is the focus of our Lenten Series this year. To whet your appetite consider the following paragraph from the section on baptism: "In baptism, therefore, every Christian has enough to study and practice all his life. He always has enough to do to believe firmly what baptism promises and brings: victory over death and the devil, forgiveness of sin, God's grace, the entire Christ, and the Holy Spirit with his gifts." (Paragraph 41, Large Catechism)

"For Lutherans, all of Christian living has its foundation in God's action in baptism. All that God's people are and can become and do grows out of God's gracious act of love in baptism. The drowning and rising (the death of the old self and the resurrection of the new person) in baptism are the daith pattern of Christian existence. Baptism saves us and call us into the "baptismal existence" that focuses daily life in service to our neighbor." I

Baptism, according to Scripture and taught by Luther, is not just a one time event that happened in our lives—it is a way of life. It marks us for life, for living our lives for Christ by making disciples. The best way we can serve our neighbor is by sharing God's love by word and deed. If they have earthly needs we help to supply them. If they have spiritual needs, and we all do, we share the Good News of Jesus Christ with them.

In Holy Baptism God washes away our sins, cleanses us, saves us, claims us as his own and fills us with his Spirit to live our lives for him. When Jesus, the sinless Son of God, got ready to begin his ministry here on earth, he submitted to John's baptism. John's baptism was a baptism of repentance. Jesus repented, not of his own sins (remember he was sinless) no he repented of our sins. He became one of us to take on our sins and pay for them by his "innocent suffering and death on the cross." If baptism was important enough for Jesus, you better believe it is absolutely necessary for us.

Beginning with Ash Wednesday, continuing with our evening Lenten services and ending with Easter Sunday, I will be using the Sola Lenten Series "Baptized: Marked for Living!" The messages each night will give us food for thought as we think about who we are as God's covenant children in baptism and how we are to live as a people forever marked with the cross of Christ. We will conclude this series by affirming our baptism on Easter Sunday, as we celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord.

I ask that each of you prayerfully consider making attending these services a priority in your life and the life of your family. As we gain a better understanding of the incredible gift God has given us in our baptism, may we be inspired to live our lives more and more for him out of a deep sense of gratitude.
