New music classes offered

Our Music Director Becky is developing two additional music classes for our children: one for ages 18 months to 3 1/2 years, and a second group for ages 3-5. (Target date to begin is still to be determined.)

All parents of children these ages should plan to meet with Becky in the Assembly Hall after church on September 4 for more information. This group would be modeled on the Kindermusik standard course of study, using instruments, stories, movement, manipulatives and music to stimulate and educate the whole child, but with spiritual emphases.

Becky was the founder of Kindermusik of Rowan in the 1990's and directed a school with an enrollment of over 120 children. The goal for our new music times is not performance, but rather family spiritual growth and holistic child development.

Parents would initially attend class with their children. Once protocol is established, the older group would begin class without parents, but be joined by their family during the last few minutes of music time.

There will be no charge and registration will open first to church members' families. If not filled, classes will then be open to the public, (perhaps for a small donation to the church's music fund?) Plan now to attend the meeting on September 4. The proceeds of this car show will benefit Brighten the Beacon projects.


Once again there will be raffle baskets full of goodies, BBQ chicken (we hope to sell 400 halves), hotdogs, drinks, etc.

Making Disciples

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you.

And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

Matthew 28:10.20 (ESV)

Matthew 28:19-20 (ESV)

In these verses from Matthew, known as the Great Commission, Jesus commands us to make disciples. And he tells us how to do it—by baptizing them in the Trinitarian name of God and teaching them what Jesus has commanded us to teach. The whole purpose is to grow the Church, the body of Christ with people who believe in Jesus as their Lord and Savior and are trained to go out make disciples, etc., etc. In other words, we are to reproduce disciples.

Now for the most part, we Lutherans have taken this to mean physically. We've been good at what I call "bedroom evangelism" literally making new Lutherans. But that only works for so long. For example, my wife and I are no longer making Lutheran Disciples that way. This way of evangelism is limited by age, but spiritually reproducing disciples has no age limit. Unfortunately we Lutherans have not been very good at the latter. But that's about to change.

I have been working with a coach from the Navigators, an organization that trains Christians to be disciple makers, for nearly two years. And in the past year I have been working and training a team of our members to be disciple makers and they are ready to begin asking members of Christiana if they would be willing to work with them to be trained to make disciples.

I am starting a new discipleship team that I will train to make disciples and they will be ready next year to go out and train people to make disciples. The plan is for this to spread throughout the congregation until most all of us are trained to spiritually reproduce disciples. Then we will be ready to go outside the congregation and reach out to non-believers and seek to make disciples of them.

Groundwork has also been laid with the Congregation Council and our Youth Director, Brittney. We're using the book "Growing in Christ" and are memorizing key Scripture verses intentionally chosen to help us be prepared to share the basics of our faith. Brittney will eventually begin working with our youth, training them to make disciples.

The vision is to change the culture of our congregation from one of taking in new members, to one of making new disciples. In order for us to be able to do that, we have to be disciples ourselves. Disciples of Jesus are obedient to him and his commands; disciples are students of the Word of God—reading it, studying it, memorizing it, and sharing it with others. Disciples are faithful pray-ers and givers. We are faithful to share our faith with others. Fellowshipping with other disciples is important to us because we gain strength and support from one another. This leads us to work together to serve one another within the body of Christ as well as outside of it.

In October I am going to be doing a sermon series on Discipleship and preaching on the areas of Obedience, Prayer, the Word, Stewardship, Fellowship and Witnessing. Please be in prayer for me that the Holy Spirit will guide me in preparing for this sermon series. Be in prayer also that the Spirit will guide each of us to be open to becoming disciples who are trained to "spiritually" reproduce and make more disciples, especially if you are asked by one of those who've been trained to do this. Pray for the culture of our congregation to become a disciple-making culture for the building up of the Kingdom and the glory of God.



Beginning September 1 at noon the Christiana Rowdy Seniors will have a cover-dish luncheon in the assembly hall of the church. Following that Pastor Carl will conduct a Bible Study entitled "A Covenant of Aging." This is a Bible Study for Mature Adults by Pr. Brad Hales. It bears in mind the unique perspective of those who have seen many years in their relationship with God, and may wonder how faith can speak anew to their daily lives. The simple, straightforward questions offered for discussion focus on Scripture texts that address some particular concerns for older (read: mature) Christians. The participants book is \$6. Bring your Bible and a pencil or pen. Pr. Carl will have the books available for purchase. See you on September 1st.

2016 NALC Convocation focuses on "Holy God, Holy Lives"

More than 400 NALC members gathered August 10-12 for the 2016 NALC Convocation in Anaheim, Calif., around the theme, "Holy God, Holy Lives." Among them representing Christiana were Richard and Linda Crouch who were our delegates; and Pastor Carl and Kathy Haynes.

Major presentations were provided by the Rev. Dr. Malcolm Guite of the University of Cambridge, England, and musician Steve Bell from Winnipeg, Manitoba. They combined to lead devotions during the Convocation and led a poetic and musical reflection on the theme. Prof. Guite also gave an address entitled, "C.S. Lewis: 'Friendship and Holiness."

The Rev. Dr. James Nestingen, a noted Lutheran historian, led a Bible study and was preacher for the Communion service.

"Holy Families" will be a special NALC emphasis as a part of the 2017 celebration of the 500th anniversary of the Reformation. A variety of resources will be available for congregations and families.

The NALC Mission Festival began the Convocation under the theme, "Faith is Made Whole in Community." Time on Wednesday and Thursday was spent focusing on what it means for the NALC to be a Mission-Driven church. Speakers included Bishop John Bradosky, Pastor Gemechis Buba, Assistant to the Bishop for Missions, and Gary Pecuch of faithwebbing.com. Delegates also focused on developing mission plans for their congregations and Mission Districts.

Elected to the NALC Executive Council to four-year terms were Lynn Kickingbird of Edmond, Okla., and Pastor Kenneth Kimball of Waterville, Iowa. Pastor David Schafer of Waukon, Iowa, was elected to the Court of Adjudication. The Convocation also ratified the election of four people to the NALC-Canada Section Governing Board.

North American Lutheran Seminary Board of Regents members were elected. Pastor Cathi Braasch of Elwood, Neb.; Donna Evans of Pittsburgh, Pa.; and Pastor Jeffray Greene of Brooks, Ga., were elected to six-year terms. Bishop Paull Spring of State College, Pa., was elected to a four-year term to fill a vacancy on the board.

2017 budgets were approved. The Convocation approved a \$2 million operating budget for the NALC. Budgets were also approved for the NALC's two designated funds: \$140,500 for the Great Commission Fund and \$525,160 for the Fund for Theological Education (which includes the North American Lutheran Seminary). Treasurer Ryan Schwarz reported that NALC "income is very substantially below budget." Many delegates expressed concerns about the shortfall and committed to addressing support for the NALC in their congregations or encouraging gifts by individuals.

The Braaten and Benne Lectures in Theology, the annual theological conference which precedes the Convocation, focused on theological perspectives on the Person of Christ. Five speakers explored the theme from different theological perspectives. The speakers were Dr. Carl Braaten, Dr. Phillip Cary, Dr. Wesley Hill, Dr. Mickey L. Mattox, and Dr. Michael Pasquarello III.

Video recordings of the NALC Convocation and the Braaten-Benne Lectures on Theology will be available for viewing online at www.thenalc.org. Documents from the Convocation and daily summaries are also available online.
